From growing up exploring the creeks and woods of Webster Groves to tranquilizing and relocating a black bear from a church in Eureka, **Tom Meister** serves as the Wildlife Damage Biologist for the Missouri Department of Conservation.

Tom has been with the Missouri Department of Conservation for 25 years as a Volunteer Naturalist, Naturalist, Visitor Center Manager, Interpretive Programs Supervisor and the last 15 years as a Wildlife Damage Biologist. In his role, he provides education, technical evaluations and training to Missourians' who are experiencing conflicts with wildlife. He is a member of the Large Carnivore Response Team and the research & relocation teams for mountain lions, feral hogs, black bears and elk.
